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

There is much of the world I want to see; I am a grandmother to two of the most wonderfully delicious people in the world; and there are other activities that I want to explore but have never had the time. It's a new season for me!

As I step away from 32 years of leading Davis Street, I am not ashamed to say that I am awed by all of the work that I've done. Davis Street went from a "little church program" that was pulled together to help moms in need. We had a pantry that provided food, and church members donated clothes to offer to families. And we operated a childcare center. We were a small place that helped families in San Leandro.

Now, Davis Street Community Center is one of the few remaining multi-service centers in the San Francisco Bay Area. We do everything to help families in need – from childcare, to providing food, to help with utilities, to dental care, to health care, to supporting that child with disabilities, to elfing for Santa every Christmas, to providing mental health care, to influencing policy, to changing city agendas, to fighting for what's needed to make this a better community. Davis Street is a force to be reckoned with – as we provide nearly 90,000 service visits each year. That's the equivalent of helping every single person in San Leandro at least once each year, and probably more often than that for some residents.

I believe that my legacy will be that of monitoring and meeting the needs of a changing world. It wasn't just the Covid-19 Pandemic that taught me the need to be able to change the way we do business very quickly. Over the years, there have been lots of political changes in the country that upended our funding over very short periods of time. And there have been cultural shifts that have impacted the way we provide services. At every change, in every season, we have responded in a way that has increased the number of families that we serve. I am very proud of this fact.

I leave Davis Street is very capable hands as it moves into its own new season of change.




retires after 46 and a half years!

The Wellness Program is designed to help improve our Consumers' overall quality of life through outlets such as art, nutrition, health education, and self-advocacy to better help their quality of life.


"Hire Steps" is a pre-vocational program that helps prepare and provide our Consumers with the tools and skills they need to apply for and obtain a job.


The Independent Living Services is a program designed to teach our Consumers the tools they need to live more independently.

Ethnicity Breakdown




A Testament to Care

Primary Care Clinic

Davis Street's Primary Care Clinic offers full medical, dental, pediatric services, behavioral health, and women's health services. We accept Medi-Cal, Medicare, Denti-Cal, many private insurance plans (Alameda Alliance, Anthem Blue Cross, Blue Shield of CA, Health Pac) and self-pay patients on a sliding scale fee (based on ability to pay).



Davis Street is proud to offer a Counseling Training Program that supports the next generation of mental health providers through training and earning hours towards their licensure. In partnership with local graduate universities, we host mental health interns who provide therapeutic services as they develop with the help of our professional staff. Davis Street offers counseling services for individuals, couples, and families beginning at the age of three years. Counseling services are provided at the Davis Street Primary Health Clinic and directly on school campuses in San Leandro Unified School District to best support the needs of our community.
